Exploring the Bay Area experience through the medium of photography brings the artst into direct conversation with each viewer by presenting images that depict reality as filtered through the artist's creative vision. These images, and this exhibit, are vicarious experiences for the viewers, inviting questions, invoking feelings, validating thoughts or, possibly, giving rise to new perspectives about interpreting our community so that the interrelationship between incongruent elements is not so abstract after all.

Our Streets, Our People: Bearing Witness, 1968-2004 Through August 14

This exhibition presents a broad overview of documentary photographer Robert Terrell's work over nearly four decades focusing on the issue of homelessness in San Francisco and other major cities in the US and around the world. The photographs present the poor, the homeless, the addicted, the underemployed, the unemployed, and those on the verge of losing control of their minds, bodies, and basic dignity. Nonetheless, they also highlight the silent dignity and inspiring perseverance of the frequently ignored and commonly misunderstood human beings who reside on the streets of far too many of the world's great cities. For over 30 years, Terrell has been photographing homeless people around the world. His exhibition will also include works created in Africa, India, China, and Germany.

Larry Schwarm: On Fire Through August 28

An exhibition of photographs of prairie fires, drawn from of a body of work created over more than decade. In Kansas, where one finds the largest remaining stretch of tallgrass prairie, an environment ever-diminished by the growth of cities, fires are set annually in a human intervention mimicking the prairie ecosystem's natural cycle of purging and regeneration. Taken at all times of day and night, Larry Schwarm's photographs capture the fires of these controlled burnings at every stage, yet the images transcend mere documentation. Responding to fire's varied manifestations and engaging the symbolic subtexts of this dynamic natural "element," the images vary from sensuous and abstract to apocalyptic or otherworldly and within this nuanced visual range one finds a startling beauty born from devastation. Printed large scale and rendered in lush colors and textures, Schwarm's photographs place the viewer in close relation to the conflagrations and the subsequent calm, and reaffirm the mystery and redemptive power of fire, one of the lasting fascinations of humankind.

Tricycle in North Thailand", which earned him prizes

in Tokyo, San Fracisco and in wider Northern

California. He had his first on-man show in Hongkong

which was sponsored by the Alliance Francaise in that city.


BOARD TALK

Alice Steele


Mikel appointed Joyce Vanman and Jim Goldstein to the Nominating Committee.
