How-to books, videos, picture books, locations, identification books -- bring them in now.

I perused last year's images and found most of them less than stunning. Then I sent some of my own images in. Low resolution prevents anyone from using them with ill purpose. After a couple of weeks, submitting an image a day with no results, I thought it must be an in house activity. But then the notice came that five of my images would be featured in January.

Wouldn't it be fun, if unbeknownst to KQED, that a whole month's worth of images chosen were from Photochrome members. 

# Apollonia Morrill, Paul Schiek, Rachel Weeks: Three New Photographers

Through February 11

"Apollonia Morrill creates color site studies of places of transition and historic sites in flux. Her photography explores the tension between representation and abstraction, creating intimate portraits of place that the artist likens to visual geography. On view will be works from her series of San Francisco's Castro Theatre that was recently exhibited in Bay Area Now 4 at Yerba Buena Center for the Arts. These beautifully resonant images focus on interior details of the building such as its plush velvet seats and elaborate light fixtures."

"Paul Schiek makes enigmatic photographs of the people and things he encounters on his constant travels throughout the country. Working mostly during the nighttime hours, Schiek's seemingly casual style spotlights and transforms an ordinary or even mundane subject, revealing something unexpected, surreal, or spectacular."

"Rachel Weeks' series Autoerotica presents sexually charged self-portraits of the artist in the poses and photographic style of Victorian erotica. Weeks portrays herself as an object of sexual desire to explore the conflict of her longing to be seen with her own shyness. By the artist claiming this privileged position, an empowering action done for the purpose of the artist's personal gratification and pleasure, the inclination to see women as victims and the object of the male gaze is challenged. The artist employs the 19th century wet collodion process to create small prints that mimic the photographic conventions of the time."

## Rudy VanderLans: 13 Big Western Landscapes

Through February 17

"Rudy VanderLans' creative output over the past 30 years is as varied as it is influential. He is the cofounder of Émigré, a world-renowned designer, a magazine and music publisher, as well as a photographer and author. For this exhibition, Rudy has extended his interest in wrestling with the form of landscape photography. This body of work stems from his book *Pages from an Imaginary Book*, in which crude halftone reproductions of his photographs are used in rendering his shots of the California desert. This rudimentary form of printing became a vehicle for Rudy in considering the very nature of how art is consumed in printed form and how the landscape is photographically glamorized and fetishized."

## **Larry Schwarm**

Through February 25

"Larry Schwarm has photographed the controlled burning of the Kansas prairies for more than a decade. Every spring, the prairies are set ablaze, burning off old grasses to make room for new growth. Schwarm's photographs capture these fires at all times of the day and night, at every stage of the burn, transcending mere documentation. Juxtaposing swatches of smoky colors, some of Schwarm's images communicate a somber intensity by palette alone. In others, mysterious clots of flame dot pastoral settings and stark lines of fire cut through the land, evoking startling associations. Printed large-scale and rendered in lush colors and textures, Schwarm's photographs describe the landscape in a language that runs from abstract to apocalyptic."
