July Photo Exhibits

Edward Weston: Masterworks from the Collection Through August 6

This exhibition of 58 photographs spans Weston's career from his early, soft-focus images in the Pictorialist style from the early 1920s through his landmark work with Group f.64 and his later, darker images from Point Lobos. The exhibit is divided into thematic sections: Early Work (Pictorialism) and Mexico; Point Lobos and the Coast; Portraits; Still Lifes; Nudes; and Landscapes. Portraits of Weston by colleagues Ansel Adams, Imogen Cunningham, Willard Van Dyke, and Beaumont Newhall are included. A selection of Weston's letters, portfolio cases, and early books and magazines containing his photographs provide an artistic and cultural context for Weston's work.

Snapshot Chronicles: Inventing the American Photo Album

Through August 20

"This deeply ambitious exhibit celebrates in rich detail the history of American vernacular photo albums from 1898 to 1935. It underscores the impact that mass-market, inexpensive cameras, which emerged at the turn of the 20th century, had on ordinary people who could now record their lives in pictures. Unlike a single snapshot that focuses attention on a single moment, photo albums offered people the challenge of assembling their photographs into sequential narratives. The albums range from small, handmade jewels to thick, storebought, faux-leather albums with black paper pages. Some albums are notable because the individual photographs are exquisite, revealing a surprising sophistication for the medium and its expressive qualities; other albums are remarkable as forms of folk art, with photos and other raw materials transformed into visual memorabilia. Albums of interest include those that chronicle the personal and professional life of an all-woman traveling circus, a mock wedding between two women, and a love affair between Al Capone and his mistress."

Brian Ulrich: Copia

Through September 2

"These large-scale photographs engage the excesses and peculiarities of American consumer culture. Begun in 2001 in response to the U.S government's call to citizens to bolster the economy through shopping, Ulrich's series offers a penetrating look at life as usual in commercial settings. The images locate private moments in busy public environments that are essentially enclosed virtual worlds, such as big-box retailers and thrift stores. Finding a mix of banality and humanity in the interactions within these spaces, the images invite the viewer to scrutinize and assess familiar rituals of consumption, while maintaining empathy for the individuals who act as our photographic stand-ins. The common activities portrayed in these images trace the contours of an ambivalent cultural psyche and present the patterns of a society in which purchasing is equated, at least rhetorically, with collective power or patriotism."
