### March Photo Exhibits By Stefan Gruenwedel

#### Group f/64 and Their Circle

Through March 31

Organized in 1932 by Ansel Adams, Edward Weston, Willard Van Dyke, Imogen Cunningham, and others to promote "straight" photography, Group f/64 appeared in response to the "artistic," soft-focus, pictorial type of fraenkelgallery.com photography that was popular at the time. They emphasized "pure" photography: sharp images, maximum depth of field, smooth glossy printing paper emphasizing the unique qualities of the photographic process. As stated in their manifesto, "The members of Group f/64 believe that photography, as an art form, must develop along lines defined by the actualities and limitations of the photographic medium, and must always remain independent of ideological conventions of art and aesthetics that are reminiscent of a period and culture antedating the growth of the medium itself." These photographs appear as part of Scott Nichols Gallery's 15th anniversary.

#### Hiroshi Sugimoto: Colors of Shadow Through March 31

This series depicts bare, interior spaces whose geometric compositions alter in surprising ways according to the angle of light affecting the surface space. Conceived as a study to observe the nature of shadows, Sugimoto designed the interior of a hilltop apartment in Tokyo specifically to facilitate his observation of the varying effects created by shadows when a surface receives light. Sugimoto coated the interior walls with shikkui, a traditional Japanese plaster finishing, so that the light would be absorbed and reflected by the surface evenly. The photographs of "Colors of Shadow," his first series photographed entirely in color, seem also

to reflect the quintessential gallery space as a white cube laid bare to expose the work of art. In this case, the work reflects its surroundings, bringing otherwise overlooked details into focus. The corners and outlying space in which the work is normally housed becomes the work itself. Further, the control of light and cast shadows produce a visual depth equaled by the sensitivity of Sugimoto's power of observation.

#### Carl De Keyzer: Zona; God, Inc.

Through April 28

These vibrant color photographs from Magnum photographer De Keyzer's "Zona" series capture surreal images of life as a detainee in the post-Soviet prison camps. Camp 27, a former gulag turned model camp in Krasnoyarsk, Siberia, functions as both a prison and a propaganda tool, shown to visiting ambassadors and Western media crews to boast the merits of the post-Soviet penal system. De Keyzer's photographs present bizarre scenes from the lives of real prisoners in a strangely fabricated reality.

In "God, Inc.," De Keyzer's black-and-white images explore the various sects of Christianity that exist in the United States, the nature of their beliefs, and how they are expressed. Traversing the country in a quintessentially American Winnebago, he photographed a number of congregations, including Midwest televangelists, Mormons staging Bible story pageants in rural upstate New York, the "sons of god" religious motorcyclists at Bike Week in Daytona Beach, and the Power Team of bodybuilders crusading for Jesus throughout Texas.
