Martin Munkacsi: Think While You Shoot!

Through September 16

"Martin Munkacsi's photographs celebrate the dynamism, speed, and energy of modern life. From his early years as a sports photographer in Hungary to his innovative photojournalism in Berlin and groundbreaking fashion shoots in New York, Munkacsi dazzled the public with his daringly experimental approach. His pictures inspired some of the great names in photo history including Henri Cartier-Bresson and Richard Avedon—yet outside of specialized circles his career has been little known. This exhibition brings to light more than 125 pictures, magazine spreads, and print layouts spanning the 1920s through the 1960s, providing a rare opportunity to view a comprehensive selection of his work."

Abbas Kiarostami: Image Maker

Through September 23

Iranian filmmaker Abbas Kiarostami is world renowned for his award-winning films, but he is also a poet, photographer, painter, illustrator, and graphic designer. Kiarostami intensified his involvement with still photography at the time of the Iranian revolution, which was also a time of personal crisis for him. In each photograph, Kiarostami sets out to distill an image to its barest essence. He has said that he regards photography as a purer medium than film, since it is relieved of the burden of narrative or entertainment. His new photographic series features roadways and landscapes framed by rain-splashed windshields. As Jonathan Curiel wrote in the *San Francisco*

Chronicle, "It's Kiarostami at his best—a man with an ability to turn simple scenes into profound canvases of beauty, chaos and poetry." This exhibit complements the film series being screened at the Pacific Film Archive this summer.

Hiroshi Sugimoto

Through September 23

The extraordinary 30-year career of Japanese photographer Hiroshi Sugimoto is celebrated in this retrospective of 120 luminous photographs made from 1976 to the present. This presentation constitutes the first major survey of Sugimoto's oeuvre and includes such iconic works as Chrysler Building (1997) and Ligurian Sea, Frumura (1993). One of Japan's most important contemporary artists, Sugimoto is known for his ongoing, multiple series of hauntingly beautiful black-andwhite photographs, which explore the themes of time, memory, dreams, and natural histories. Working with a large-format camera, his glowing images range from the starkly minimal to the richly detailed, and are often suffused with expanses of light and space.
