



That's when Photochrome members and guests spend the day looking at the year's best images of the entire 2007 year. We'll also see entries in the Special Awards Categories. A potluck lunch will be served.

Image of the Year: A special crew of judges will be on hand to select the best in Pictorial, Nature, Creative, PJ, and Travel. They will also choose the winners in our Special Awards Categories.

If you shoot film, your job is to go through your entries for 2007 and pick out all your *slides* that placed—from Honorable Mention on up. Sort them and bundle each category, identify with care, and place them in the category-specific receptacles that will be available **November 1**. If you can't be there, perhaps ask a friend to bring them for you.

Digital images are already on file and except for Special Awards do not need to be reentered. Please see rules below for submitting to Special Awards..

Here is a review for the *Special Awards* judging. In each Special Awards category, up to 4 images may be entered. Slide/Digital entries for the Special Awards may be ones which have placed during the year in a regular category but which you choose to enter into the special category, or they may be Slides/Digital never before entered. Entries will be judged in *either* the Image of the Year competition, *or* the Special Awards categories.

Jack Cannon Perpetual Trophy. Best image of a recognizable San Francisco subject.

Walter F Sullivan Memorial Award. Best image of a landscape or seascape.

Jules H. Strauss Memorial Award. Best image of a floral subject.

Dr Jose Humberto Arrieta Memorial Award. Best Portrait image of a human subject.

Roy Humphreys Memorial Award. Best image of a rose. It may be a single rose, a bouquet or a garden. **Margot & Jacques Segal Award.** Best image taken in one of America's National Parks or National Monuments. It

includes National Parks of Alberta and British Columbia, Canada. It should depict a characteristic site, rather than an obscure, though lovely, scenic. It should leave no doubt where it was taken.

The Image deadline is Pictorial Night, 11/1, but may be submitted earlier.

Matthias Geiger: Tide

Through October 20

"This series concerns itself with the ebb and flow of people as they pass through time and place. Using a computer-based technique of layering the still images he shoots, Geiger erases the physical presence of the figures in his work, leaving just a trace of their forms in the landscape. These almost metaphysical

presences haunt places of transit and places of momentary rest." Geiger describes his series as "an examination of human presence" in "places of transit and momentary rest.... The technique of layering still images allows past, present, and future moments to appear simultaneously, reflecting the notion that each moment in time is a construct of our memories, our presence, and our projections."

Raising the Bar: New Horizons in Disability Sports

Through October 21

This traveling photographic exhibition "is an intimate portrayal of the international para-athletic community: individuals with disabilities who compete in a wide panoply of events—from fencing to boccia, shot put to downhill slalom, cycling to equestrian events, swimming and wheelchair tennis to sitting volleyball and sailing. From the first international games in 1952 at Stoke Mandeville to today's newly high-profile Paralympic events, the athletes who strive for excellence against physical challenges and social stigma are true pioneers. They bring new depth and dignity to the human effort to succeed and excel against hostile odds. With striking images taken by award-winning international photographers, the exhibition is a paean to diversity in many aspects: sport, disability, nationality, and gender."

"Comprised of approximately 60 prints, this exhibit concentrates on the years beginning in 1956 through 1962. During these six years, Arbus staked out a vision that was emphatically and entirely her own. Many of her central subjects—people on the street and in parks, circus performers, couples, female impersonators, and muscle men—were established in this period. Arbus would continue to return to these subjects until her death in 1971."

"This series focuses on the journeys of refugees and immigrants from war-torn or economically devastated homelands in Iraq, Somalia, Sudan, Palestine, Afghanistan, the Philippines, and elsewhere to settle in Europe, specifically Greece and Ukraine. In June, the Foundation Henri Cartier-Bresson in Paris presented the artist, Jim Goldberg, with the HCB Award so he could travel to his subjects' countries of origin and tell the complete stories of their migration."
