Open Pictorial

Members may exhibit one image per evening. It may be on any subject, creative, nature, PJ, travel, or pictorial. It may be your strongest image or a "problem child." Digital makers are encouraged to use the email submission method but, as usual, may bring the image to the meeting on a flash drive or similar. Slide makers bring their work and place it in the waiting carrousel. Members must be present when their images are shown. No outside judges will be present. It's strictly a group discussion. No record will be kept of entries. Open Pictorials are not competitions, unless announced as such. They are learning/teaching experiences.

Competition Open Pictorial

The March Open Pictorial will be Competitive. A good outside judge will be present. However, discussion will still occur. Depending on entries (Still one image per member) a number of winners will be selected. All images will be judged together. There will be no levels, or group categories, like A, AA, AAA, etc. Eligible images may go on to N4C competition.

Print Night

Also expected to be held about once a quarter, prints will be judged competitively by members, much as they are now. Eligible prints will go on to N4C.

Theme Night

Something like the old "Assigned Subject" category, Theme Nights are meant to encourage our members to get out and shoot new subjects, look at our world a little differently in their every day pursuits, and find an original way to present the Theme Subject. The first one is "Water". Let's save fog and clouds for another time, and concentrate on—well—water! There's enough of the substance around, from our taps to our gardens, the bay and ocean. Each member submits one image for group discussion. Should we have "winners" in this category? What do YOU think.

Exploring Photography

The second meeting of the month is designed to share photography insights or tips. (In other words, education.) In addition, we'll show members' images, like "Show me Six," which could (for example) be a photo essay. This segment could also contain a short travelog of images, like the "Africa" presentation by Alan Heald and B. K. Srinivas scheduled for February.

Remember: Everything here is subject to revision as the evenings play out.
